Afera's 1st Tape College and 2nd Technical Seminar a Success

The Hague, The Netherlands, April 7, 2004

Afera, the European Association for the Self Adhesive Tape Industry, today pronounced its recent technical events a notable success, gauged by high rates of attendance and the positive results of a comprehensive participant questionnaire. Afera launched its 1st Tape College March 23–24, 2004 at the Marriott Hotel in Brussels, Belgium, followed by the 2nd biennial Technical Seminar on March 25–26, 2004. Both events attracted a wide range of participants from around the globe for a total of four days of technical lectures and networking.

With 90 participants from 16 countries, the Tape College was a first-time, 1½-day educational course designed to offer anyone in the tape business the chance to polish their fundamental industry knowledge by 'going to school' with the experts, exploring the basics of design, manufacture, application and testing with tape industry authorities. Event capacity was quickly filled with mostly those from R&D and technical divisions, eager to learn from and mingle with their tape industry compatriots.

Of the 10 'classes' held at the Tape College, the presentations "Technology and Applications of Acrylic Pressure Sensitive Adhesives," given by Don Pierson of Rohm and Haas (U.S.A.) and "The Chemistry of Tackifying Resins and Their Interaction with Various Polymers," delivered by Chrétien Donker of Eastman Chemical Middelburg (Netherlands), received the highest ratings according to the results of a participant questionnaire. Extensive feedback further revealed that attendees were impressed with the high level of organisation, quality of presentations and relevance of industry information provided by the Tape College.

"Never before have I seen participants so diverse in talents and backgrounds come together at such a well-timed, well-organised event as the Tape College," remarked attendee Robert Moore, a board member of the ADCCAT Association (U.K.). "The program provided a well-rounded information exchange with interesting lectures and time to socialize with our colleagues in the tape industry."

Unique to Europe and open to all tape industry professionals, the Tape College was loosely modelled on Tape University 101, organised by Afera's American counterpart association, the Pressure Sensitive Tape Council (PSTC). Participants experienced a genuine sense of completion at the conclusion of the Tape College when an informal, American–style graduation ceremony was held and the 'graduates' were individually recognised and awarded certificates of completion by Afera's Technical Committee Chairman, Lutz Jacob of ExxonMobil Chemical Europe, and Afera's Secretary–General, Astrid Lejeune.

The Tape College was organised as a prelude to the 2nd biennial Technical Seminar, held at the same venue on March 25–26, 2004. Following the enormous success of the 1st Technical Seminar launched in 2002, the two-day event was again geared toward creating a collaborative platform for cutting-edge technical issues and developments relevant to the world-wide self adhesive tape market. This year's attendance numbered 124 industry professionals from 17 countries.

The highlights of the Technical Seminar's 21 presentations included the papers "New High Performance Styrenic Block Copolymers for Hot Melt Adhesives," presented by Noel De Keyzer of Kraton Polymers Research (Belgium), and "From Adhesion to Release Using a Probe Method," presented by Costantino Creton of Laboratoire PCSM-ESPCI, Paris University (France).

"The Technical Seminar provided the perfect setting for reconnecting with the innovations and people driving the adhesive tape industry," commented attendee Michael Gerstenberger of Verlag Coating Thomas & Co. (Switzerland). The participants, largely from R&D, technical, sales and marketing divisions of tape companies, gave highly positive feedback on the event, commenting specifically on the advantageous blend of seminar topics. Attendees of both technical events also expressed their satisfaction with the discounted combined participation fee.

The success of the 1st Tape College and the 2nd Technical Seminar has ensured that they will be hosted again by Afera in 2005/2006. Afera organises these and other events to serve a variety of levels and areas of interest and know-how within the tape industry.
